P-H-M Education Foundation launches naming rights campaign

Funds will support the Foundation's endowment; signs recognize donors

With the approval of the P-H-M School Board and the support of Dr. Jerry Thacker, the P-H-M Education Foundation announced a \$4 million naming rights campaign. This campaign will support the Foundation's endowment. It is the goal of the Foundation to cover the operating costs from the endowment draw, so that every dollar raised in the future will go to P-H-M students in the form of grants.

Signs have started to appear throughout the P-H-M district. Local law firm May Oberfell Lorber named the Penn High School softball field. Also named are the Lionshead Tire & Specialty Soccer Field; Dar and Dot Wiekamp Tennis Courts; the Doshi Family Band

Room (in Penn High School); and the Schwartz Family Music and Choral rooms throughout the district.

Eighty percent of the funds will be held in the Foundation's endowment account, while the remaining funds will support professional de-

velopment opportunities for P-H-M staff members. The 12-year naming rights is an unique marketing opportunity for businesses, and a way for families to honor an educator.
