Next Steps for Seniors

- Begin the application process. To complete the application process you'll need, at minimum, these three things:
 - Completed application (with fee)
 - Official high school transcript
 - SAT/ACT scores

Next Steps...Applying to College

- NOVEMBER 1st is the deadline for most schools for the early admissions deadline and also merit based scholarship consideration.
 - If you want to be considered for merit based scholarships from the schools you are applying to, you need to have applications submitted by NOV 1st.
 - Refer to each school's website for the criteria of merit based scholarships.

Applying...

- Complete an online application (two forms):
 - Common Application
 - School specific online application
 - Each individual school will provide information on their application process at their website.


- Common Application: all-inclusive application, you choose the schools that download the application.
- Common Application can be accessed from two sources:
 - Visit
 Which you want to apply and you will be directed to the Common Application.

Applying...Common Application

Common Application:

- To send transcripts for schools using Common App, invite your counselor from the tab labeled "Recommenders".
- If we do not have your Senior Profile, we will NOT be able to write much about you!
- All Common and college applications needing to be processed by November 1 (big deadline for many schools for their scholarship consideration) must be submitted no later than October 20--Friday. Applications submitted after October 20th may not be processed by the November 1 deadline since we will be on Fall break from October 26-Oct 29.
- When invited, your counselor will submit the following:
 - Counselor letter of recommendation (if required)
 - Official transcript
 - Secondary school report (includes academic information)
- Repeat the invitation process to invite other recommenders including teachers and community members.

A note on letters of recommendation:

- Please give counselors (and teachers) at least two weeks notice to complete your application materials and letters of recommendation.
- Also, provide a copy of your Student Profile for more detailed letters of rec.-a link was sent via Mr. Penney in the College Res. Room—you may print and a bring in or electronically send to us! We need these ASAP!

Next Steps...SAT/ACT

- If you are planning on applying to a 4 year college, an SAT or ACT is a <u>requirement</u> to complete your application process.
- SAT three sections (Critical Reading, Math, Writing {optional})
 - To register to take the SAT visit: www.collegeboard.org
- ACT five sections (Reading, Math, Science, English, Writing {optional})
 - To register to take the ACT visit:

SAT/ACT continued...

- Can I get my test scores sent for free?
 - When you register for one of these tests, you have the option to have scores sent to four schools as a part of your registration.
 - Take advantage of this option or you will have to pay for additional scores to be sent.
- What if I already took a test, but did not have my scores sent to a school that I am applying to?
 - Go to the website of the testing agency (Collegeboard or ACT) and
 - log in to the account you created when you registered for the test.
 - 3. Click on "send scores" (there is a fee)

SAT/ACT continued...

• FAQ: I am applying to a community college such as IVY Tech and heard I don't need to take the SAT or ACT, true? It is true that many community colleges offer placement tests as alternatives for placement, yes. However, we recommend taking an ACT/SAT because plans can change.

• FAQ: Does it matter which test I take? No, either test is accepted at every college with no preference.

Fee Waivers

- Fee waivers help students, who qualify, with expenses such as taking the SAT or ACT and paying for college application fees.
 - You may qualify for one if you are on a "free or reduced" lunch program.
 - Ask your counselor for the fee waiver forms if you think you might qualify
- Also, individual schools may offer fee waivers during special events such as IUSB waives application fees for seniors that meet with an academic advisor at our onsite admission days. See sign up info in CCRC.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

Scholarships...Pennseniors Accepted: \$9 million In scholarships last year...do not doubt that you could qualify for something!

- How do I go about hunting for scholarships?
- 1. Some scholarships (merit based) are available through the colleges that you are applying to and you may be considered for them automatically if you apply by Nov. 1st and meet the minimum criteria
- 2. Other scholarships, from the colleges that you apply to, may require you to apply for them separately. You should search for the "scholarship page" of the college's website and see if there are any like this that you may qualify for.







• IMPORTANT CHANGES TO FAFSA:

- The 2019/2020 FAFSA is now available for completion starting October 1, 2018.
- <u>2017 tax</u> information will be utilized to complete the 2019/2020 FAFSA.
- For state financial aid consideration, FAFSA is still due <u>April 15, 2019</u>.

- To complete/submit your FAFSA online, you and your parents MUST apply for an FSA ID (can be done at anytime).
