Penn# 0149 INTRODUCTION TO TWO-DIMENSIONAL ART Semesters: 1 Credit: 1 Grade Level: 9-12 Weight: 4.0 DOE# 4000 Course Description:

Introduction to 2-Dimensional Art is a 1-semester course intended to provide students with the basic skills and techniques in drawing, painting, design and printmaking. The 2/D course will help students generate new ideas, develop artistic skills, and foster student imagination. Pencil, chalk, marker. charcoal, colored pencil. tempera, acrylics, oil pastels and scratchboard may be some of the materials students will explore. Our goal is one in which students gain an appreciation for the arts, and learn how the arts can be integrated into other areas of study.

Penn# 0101/0102 PAINTING I & II Semesters: 2 Credits: 2 Grade Level: 9-12 Weight: 4.0 DOE# 4064 Course Description:

2-D Intro to or 3-D Art recommended. This course is an introduction to the basic principles of painting. Students will have an opportunity explore various to techniques associated with watercolor, tempera, acrylics, and oil paints. Connections will be made between historically significant painters and periods of art. First year painting students will learn to merge the brush stroke with their imagination.

The Advanced Placement® (AP®) Studio Art program enables highly motivated students to do college-level work in studio art while still in high school. The program is intended to help students build a professional portfolio that can be submitted for entrance to an Art College, University, or Institute as well as scholarship opportunities. Guidelines for Advanced Placement® Studio Art portfolios have been designed to accommodate a variety of interests and approaches to The AP Art and Design Program includes three different courses: AP 2-D Art and Design, AP 3-D Art and Design, and AP Drawing. In each course, you'll investigate materials, processes, and ideas. You'll make works of art and design by practicing, experimenting, and revising, and you will communicate your ideas about art and design through written and visual expression.

In an AP Art and Design course, you'll develop the skills that artists and designers use and create a portfolio of work you'll submit for an AP score.
