# Penn Accelerated College Program (CTE)

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- Begin college coursework before you graduate
- You earn **college credit** and **high school credit**
- **Tuition** is paid by the State of Indiana
- **You must provide your own transportation**
- Classes may be held in the morning, afternoon or evening.
- To take a course at a college you must qualify for admittance as well as Penn's criteria (see Program of Studies)
- Includes Cosmetology at Michiana Beauty
- Pharmacy Technician Training ( Seniors only) 10 week program

# Indiana Graduation Requirements

## INDIANA CORE40

Effective beginning with students who enter high school in 2012-13 school year (class of 2016).

Course and Credit Requirements	
English/ Language Arts	8 credits Including a balance of literature, composition and speech.
Mathematics	6 credits (in grades 9-12) 2 credits: Algebra I 2 credits: Geometry 2 credits: Algebra II <small>Or complete Integrated Math I, II, and III for 6 credits. Students must take a math or quantitative reasoning course each year in high school.</small>
Science	6 credits 2 credits: Biology I 2 credits: Chemistry I or Physics I or Integrated Chemistry-Physics 2 credits: any Core 40 science course
Social Studies	6 credits 2 credits: U.S. History 1 credit: U.S. Government 1 credit: Economics 2 credits: World History/Civilization or Geography/History of the World
Directed Electives	5 credits World Languages Fine Arts Career and Technical Education
Physical Education	2 credits
Health and Wellness	1 credit
Electives*	6 credits <small>(College and Career Pathway courses recommended)</small>
<b>40 Total State Credits Required</b>	

\*Students may have additional local graduation requirements that apply to all students.

## CORE40 with Academic Honors (minimum 47 credits)

For the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits.
- Earn 8-8 Core 40 world language credits (8 credits in one language or 4 credits each in two languages).
- Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits.
- Earn a grade of a "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following:
  - A. Earn 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams
  - B. Earn 6 verifiable transcripted college credits in dual credit courses from the approved dual credit list.
  - C. Earn two of the following:
    1. A minimum of 3 verifiable transcripted college credits from the approved dual credit list,
    2. 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exams,
    3. 2 credits in IB standard level courses and corresponding IB exams.
  - D. Earn a combined score of 1750 or higher on the SAT critical reading, mathematics and writing sections and a minimum score of 530 on each
  - E. Earn an ACT composite score of 26 or higher and complete written section
  - F. Earn 4 credits in IB courses and take corresponding IB exams.

# AP? ACP?

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## **Advance Placement**

- Created by College Board
- Test at the end may get you some college credits. Score of a 3 or higher
- Fee for some classes to take the end of year test

## **ACP- Advance College Project IU's Dual Credit Program**

- Run by Indiana University
- 3 credits for each class if tuition is paid
- Fee of \$25 per credit hour or so for tuition

paid to IU

# Senior Level English Options

- English 12
- Ivy Tech English 111/112
  - Course focuses non-fiction text and writing
  - Must meet requirements for dual credit.
- AP English Literature – Summer reading mandatory - Literature is for the student who *loves to read* poetry, plays and literary fiction even if she loves STEM classes more. It is for the student who may never have the opportunity to take a literature course again because his undergraduate years include a long haul of Organic Chemistry. It is for the student who relishes making connections and discoveries.
- ACP Composition & Literature
  - College Level, 1 semester of Reading & 1 semester of Writing , college credit earned if C or better





# Still need Math credits?



- **Core 40** Requires a full year of: **Algebra I, Algebra II** and **Geometry**. (6 credits)
- **Honors Diploma** Requires an additional year of Math... above Algebra 2... (Precalc/Trig, Finite, Calculus, etc)  
Grades above C-
- Colleges like to see a senior math class
- Can't decide what to take? **Ask your math teacher for his/her recommendation.**

# Do you need a Science class?

- Core 40 and Honors Diploma require 6 science credits
- Biology & ICP or Chemistry are required for Core 40 & above diplomas! (4 credits)
- Need a 3<sup>rd</sup> year of Science (lab)

(Adv. Env. Science, Anatomy & Physiology, Physics, PLTW sciences, etc.)

Search for options in Science section of the course menu or in the Program of Studies. Make sure to pay attention to prerequisites.





# Do you need World Language credits ?

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- Most colleges require two years
- More selective colleges require three or four years
- Not required for Core 40 but **strongly encouraged!!!!**
- **Academic honors requires of 3 years of same language OR 4 credits each in two languages (not online)**

# Schedule Change /Drop Policy

## **Schedule Change Policy**

It is the school's position that schedule changes after the school year begins disrupt instructional time. Since staffing and the master schedule are determined by student course selection, students are expected to honor the commitment they make when selecting courses and the spring deadline for making schedule changes.

There are, however, circumstances that warrant a schedule change. Schedule change requests prior to school starting must meet at least one of the following criteria:

### **Criteria for schedule changes:**

1. Failure to meet course prerequisites
2. Failure to meet graduation requirements.
3. Change in college or career plans.
4. Course changes due to completion of summer school.
5. Inappropriate level placement.
6. Students earning a failing grade from the teacher the previous year.
7. Incomplete Schedule - not enough classes listed on schedule.
8. Schedule Conflict – two of the student's selected courses are offered only during the same block.

# Drop Policy Reasons

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## **Criteria for schedule changes after the start of school:**

1. Extenuating circumstances, such as hardship or extended illness.
2. Changes in a course or a course level, if appropriate, are considered. The student, teacher, or parent may initiate the discussion for a course level change. In any case, and prior to any determination, the teacher, student, and parent must first have a conversation to determine the appropriate recommendation, and all three parties must sign a course level adjustment form which must be obtained from the school counselor. Academy leaders and counselors are involved as needed.
3. Course level changes must be completed as soon as possible in the semester.
4. Courses may not be changed or added after the second week of school.
5. Courses dropped after the fourth full week of school will result in a grade of W/F (withdraw/fail) on the student's transcript.
6. Requests for teacher changes will not be honored.
