



# Kingsmen Athletic Center & Plaza



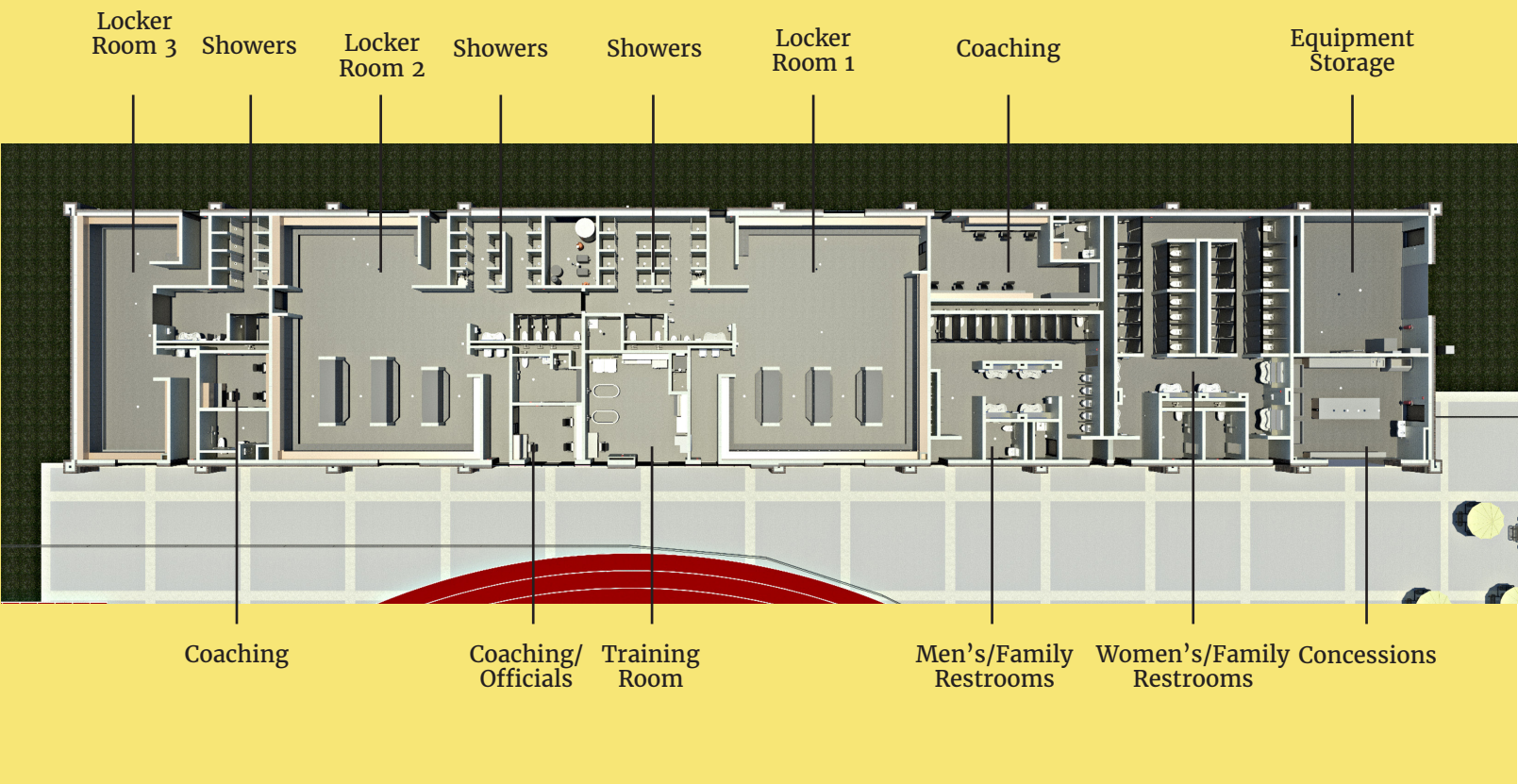
The new Kingsmen Athletic Center & Plaza provide a safe environment for Penn High School student-athletes and visiting teams, while also enhancing the patron experience.

The new building provides much-needed space for Penn High School student-athletes, both in the new facility and in the existing high school. The design includes three new locker rooms to support Fall and Spring sports: Football (varsity, JV and Freshmen teams), Track & Field (boys and girls) and Girls Lacrosse.

The two larger home locker room areas include integrated team meeting and film areas with video projection, while all three locker rooms have an adjacent coaching staff office space for supervision. The addition of a training room at TCU Freed Field will give Penn athletic trainers on-site access to equipment and medical treatment supplies. The new building also provides private facilities for sports officials.

The Kingsmen Athletic Center & Plaza also add features on the south end of TCU Freed Field where none previously existed. Public rest rooms have been added for both women and men, along with three family rest rooms. Patrons will also enjoy the added benefit of a new concession stand and family plaza area for eating and socializing.

The functionality of the new building design gives Penn High School maximum flexibility. Building systems are designed to support year-round use or to be shut down in the winter.



**Zolman's Tire Concessions Stand:** P-H-M community business partner Zolman's Tire has committed to donate an additional \$25,000 (over 12 years) to the P-H-M Education Foundation for naming rights of the new south end concession stand. Zolman's made the same commitment in 2016 to name the north end zone concession stand. The mission of the Education Foundation is to develop alternative sources of income to support education initiatives in P-H-M by strengthening partnerships between the community and the District. PHMEF supports education through awarding innovative teaching grants, scholarships to students, staff development and other corporation-wide initiatives. Per PHMEF's naming rights campaign, 80 percent of the donation goes into the Foundation's endowment. The remaining 20 percent will directly fund professional development initiatives for P-H-M teachers.
